



### Call to Order

- James Adams, Chairperson, called the meeting to order at 11:05 a.m.

### Approval of Minutes

### Executive Secretary Report

- Ms. Youst informed the Board that she would be in system testing for the next five weeks testing the new licensing system. She will be out of the office from August 4 through September 5, 2014.
- Ms. Youst informed the Board that she expects the new system to be extremely beneficial for the office and also very user friendly for the registrants.
- One of the perks of the new system will be the ability to apply and pay for applications and renewals online.
- Ms. Youst informed the Board that she would provide more information on the proposed go live date of the new system once it becomes available.

**NEHA Examination Scoring Change**

- Stephanie Youst informed the Board that NEHA changed the examination scoring process from a percentage to a standardized score effective July 13, 2014. The August 21, 2014 will be the first examination the Board will proctor with the new scoring system.
- The Board instructed Ms. Youst to contact NEHA to obtain the conversion rate for the exam. The Board will still be using a 70% or equivalent as the passing point for the examination.
- The Examination Committee will be meeting with a statistician to better understand NEHA’s scoring method and to determine if the Board still wants to require the equivalent of 70% as the passing score.

**Rule Review**

- The Board reviewed the public comments received on rule 4736-8-01 and all rules up for review in 2015.
  - The Board members acknowledged receipt of the comments and thanked those who commented.

**Fee Discounts or Waivers for Current Service Members**

- The Board discussed the possibility of waiving or discounting fees for applications and renewal for current military service members.
- The Board determined that, because the fees are established by law, they do not have sufficient statutory authority to discount or waive fees for anyone at this time.

- The Board members discussed the current verification form that is available for sanitarians to use to verify their attendance at continuing education activities.
- The Board requested that Ms. Youst update the verification form and include a start and stop time for the course as part of the supervisor verification.



### NEHA Announces Passing Score for New REHS/RS Exam

The National Environmental Health Association (NEHA) will be unveiling the new version of its REHS/RS examination on July 13, 2014, at the 78th Annual Educational Conference & Exhibition.

Recently, NEHA worked with Professional Testing Inc. (PTI) and a group of subject matter experts to determine the new passing score for the revised exam.

From that meeting, the following was determined:

- In an effort to standardize the score reporting process across all of NEHA's examination programs NEHA has decided to implement scaled scoring. Therefore, in the near future, all NEHA examinations will have a standard passing score of 650 no matter the examination program or form.
- Beginning July 13, 2014, the NEHA REHS/RS examination will report scores using scaled scores that range from 0 to 900 with a passing score of 650. The raw passing score is mathematically transformed so that the passing scaled score equals 650. This process is similar to the way one adjusts Celsius and Fahrenheit temperature scales. While the values may differ the temperatures are the same. For example, water boils at the same temperature regardless of the scaled used.
- Candidates who pass the examination will earn scaled scores of 650 and above, and those who fail will earn a scaled score between 0 and 649. A scaled score is NOT a percentage score. In summary, a scaled score is merely a transformation of a raw score. Scaling is done to report comparable results when forms and raw passing scores vary over time.

The REHS/RS examination consists of a total of 250 multiple-choice questions. The exam is split into two parts of 125 questions each. Candidates are given a total of four (4) hours to complete the entire exam or two (2) hours for each part with a short 15-minute break in between. Of the 250 items, 225 will be scored. The remaining 25 questions will be unscored, pilot questions. Those items will not be called out within the exam.

Hi Stephanie,

(I know I sent you this comment/suggestion in the past, but figured it couldn't hurt to respond with it again):

If at all possible, I would like to see a provision in the registration requirements for consideration of years served in the field, in lieu of the college course requirements; along with passing of the state exam. This would allow those individuals who have served in the public/environmental health profession for years without having had the background college courses, to be eligible for a sort of "grandfathering" into RS certification, when age and practicality would preclude them from reasonably returning to school for the college credit. I know there are individuals out there who have demonstrated capability to qualify as an RS through years of service who don't have and likely couldn't practically obtain the college course credit, but whom "deserve" consideration of RS certification, assuming they pass the exam, anyway.

I feel that rule 4736-7-02 (ORC 4736-12) has an adverse impact to business. Specifically, the cost of sanitarian registration and/or the frequency of renewal higher than necessary and the cost is passed on to businesses in the form of license fees and permits. As a fringe benefit, the health departments pay for sanitarian registration and the cost is calculated into the price of the licenses and permits. Licenses and permits are paid for by business operators and general citizens.

My suggestion is to increase the time between registration renewals from 1 year to 4 years and/or decrease the registration fee \$80 to \$20.
